GLRC and Easter Seals Michigan are pleased to launch the LUNA program to children ages 2-18 throughout Upper Michigan. LUNA, which stands for Look, Uncover, Nurture, Act is a comprehensive assessment process to identify the impact of trauma on a child. A multidisciplinary assessment team administers psychological, speech, language and occupational therapy, and neurological metrics, to identify how much trauma has impacted the child. Families are provided with individualized recommendations to meet their needs. LUNA is the first program that addresses children with trauma while using the power of technology to take the first step in seeking help. LUNA is made possible by a \$4.1 million dollar grant from the Michigan Health Endowment Fund. To begin, take the free, confidential assessment at www.greatlakesrecovery.org/luna.

Great Lakes Recovery Centers

Great Lakes Recovery Centers, Inc. (GLRC) is a 501 (c) 3 non-profit agency that provides behavioral health services and rehabilitation programming. Some of the services offered include primary residential and outpatient treatment, prisoner re-entry, peer recovery, veterans services, etc. We are one of the few providers that offer residential treatment specific to adolescents. GLRC has been in existence since 1983 and currently provides services in thirteen communities across Michigan's Upper Peninsula.

Our mission is to empower recovery through hope and change.

Outpatient Centers

Great Lakes Recovery Centers has 13 outpatient treatment centers located throughout Michigan's Upper Peninsula. The outpatient approach on recovery is less intensive than residential services, but offers a more flexible approach for those who need the freedom to work or attend school. Clients meet regularly with counselors and focus on gaining the skills needed to live life in recovery.

Our clinicians are trained to recognize and personalize treatment plans for adults, adolescents, and children troubled by:

- Anxiety or Depression
- Stress conflicts or relationship difficulties
- Trauma or abuse (PTSD)
- Alcoholism or Substance Abuse
- Eating disorders
- Attention, conduct and educational issues
- Sexual disorders and addiction

Residential Centers

Great Lakes Recovery Centers has residential treatment centers for youth in Negaunee, for adults in Marquette, and a Women's and Men's New Hope House in Sault Ste. Marie. Residential substance abuse treatment allows clients to live in a therapeutic environment, along-side their peers, with access to on-site clinicians. The general intent is to provide the tools that will allow clients to cease substance abuse and avoid negative consequences that can impact their life. Clients suffer from symptoms of dependence from psychoactive substances such as alcohol, prescription drugs or various "street drugs" like heroine, amphetamines or cocaine.

Treatment usually includes:

- Assessment of physical & mental health, substance abuse & coordination of medical services.
- A designated counselor and an individualized treatment plan for each client.
- Individual and group therapy sessions.
- Transition planning
