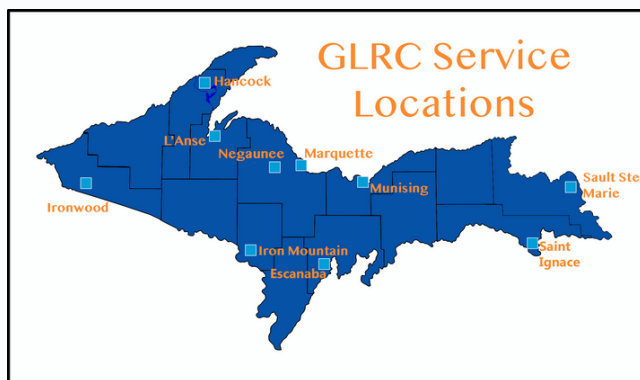

OS Reentry Services

Mission

The mission of the Michigan OS Model is to create a safer Michigan by holding clients accountable while promoting their success.

Vision

Through innovative programming and case management, the vision of the Michigan OS Model is to provide every client knowledge, skills, resources, and opportunities to be successful and productive members of the community.

How is this accomplished?

The mission is accomplished by targeting service provision to meet the identified needs of returning offenders, thereby reducing their risk of recidivism and enhancing their education and employment opportunities. OS Reentry Services employs specialists to assure all counties have adequate services and vendors to meet the needs of all returning citizens. They also develop employer relationships to provide employment opportunities to returning citizens, and coordinate job placement activities for program participants.

Program Eligibility and Referrals

Screenings to determine program eligibility are completed by the Michigan Department of Corrections (MDOC) while individuals are incarcerated in a State of Michigan facility. Referrals for services must come from MDOC Parole Agents. If you know of an individual that may benefit from OS Reentry Services, please encourage them to reach out to the MDOC. Referrals from friends/family or other local service providers are not accepted.
