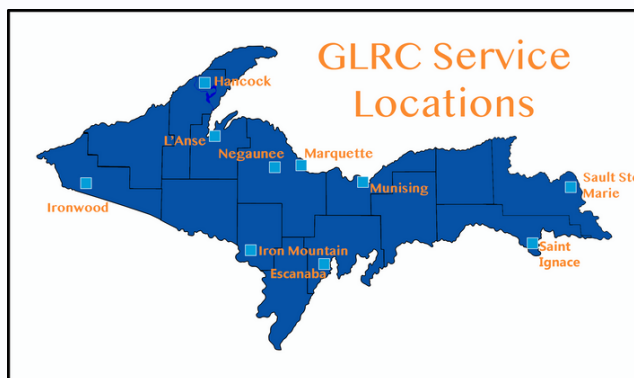

Veterans Services

Counseling and Readjustment

Great Lakes Recovery Centers provides readjustment counseling across the Upper Peninsula. Outpatient services is an opportunity for clients to walk through the assessment process with a trained clinician to determine the treatment that is relevant for them. Specific readjustment services are offered for veterans. GLRC also offers weekly support groups based out of Negaunee and Marquette for veterans located in Marquette County.

Residential Facilities

GLRC also works closely with the VA to provide homeless veterans with a place to stay. Beds are available at the adult residential facilities in Marquette and Sault Ste. Marie to temporarily house homeless veterans. As a result of such a high rate of substance use and mental health disorders among homeless veterans, this program currently provides space for them in our residential service programs so that they get access to shelter and necessary services.

Peer Recovery

Peer Recovery services are available through GLRC in Chippewa, Delta, and Marquette counties. State Certified Peer Recovery Coaches provide a variety of services in the community. These coaches have been living in recovery for a number of years and are a great resource to clients as they have a personal understanding with recovery.

Instruments of Peace

Instruments of Peace (IOP) is a program offering hope to area veterans. Members of IOP may expect short, weekly, spiritually insightful meditations to help guide and encourage you on your journey, plus a weekly IOP kindness suggestion. The encouraging messages are presented by Pastor Chuck Tooman, US Army Veteran, GLRC Chaplain, Hospice Chaplain, and Instrument of Peace.

Instruments of Peace, American Veterans Nurturing Healthy Spirituality, is a growing corps of American Veterans praying frequently and living with conviction that the values that were served and fought for will be restored and prevail at home and abroad in this and future generations.

The rationale of the program is that veterans must nurture healthy spirituality because unhealthy spirituality is what creates veterans. Example: selfishness, in one form or another, has started every war and motivates every crime and social injustice imaginable. Social injustice has its roots in selfishness, and selfishness is rooted in emptiness, and emptiness is an expression of an unhealthy spirituality.

The orientation of IOP is the power and presence of the Holy Trinity God our Father and Creator, Jesus our crucified and risen Christ, and their Spirit present among us. There is no other point of orientation or context for healthy spirituality. Neutrality is not a point of orientation.

Other Services

Foster Care

GLRC's MDHHS Regional Resource Team provides information about becoming a foster parent, supports current foster parents, and provides comprehensive training for those interested in becoming foster parents. For more information call (920) 517-8733.

Prevention Services
