About Residential Services

Residential substance use treatment refers to a short-term (30 day) or long-term (more than 30 day) arrangement, where clients live in a therapeutic environment for individuals living in recovery. Staff are committed to helping residents gain life skills, make healthy decisions, and strengthen their recovery.

Individual Treatment

Each client is assigned a counselor who provides oneon-one services and meets frequently with them throughout their stay. Counselors help residents identify their personal strengths and establish/maintain support systems they will need in order to live in recovery.

Family Program

Specially furnished suites accommodate clients with dependent children (up to age 11). During the academic year, busses transport clients' school-age children to and from school and on-site care is provided for younger children while their mothers are in groups. Parenting classes are offered to mothers with children of all ages. We work to connect clients with necessary services including OB/GYN and pediatric referrals, WIC, DHHS, vocational services and more.

Group Therapy

Group therapy sessions are facilitated by qualified staff members and conducted daily. During these sessions, clients focus on acquiring new living skills and learning to put them into practice.

Transition Planning

From the first day of treatment, residents are planning for their return home. Our goal is to help everyone obtain access to the care and assistance they'll need, including employment, housing, family support and follow-up medical and/or behavioral health services.

Social Detox Services

All adult residential services sites offer Social Detox Services to medically stable clients as they withdraw from alcohol or drugs. Extensive monitoring and care is provided for these clients. Services are intended for individuals experiencing "sub-acute detox" to reside for a shortened time frame. Sub-acute detoxification refers to clients who are experiencing intoxication or withdrawal symptoms that are severe enough to cause impairment, but are not so severe that they require medical attention.

Community Involvement

We believe in the healthy effects of giving back to the community and helping others. Our clients participate in a wide variety of civic and charitable activities during treatment.
